## **Oils**

**In today's Gospel, the apostles go out on mission and we are told heal the sick through the anointing with oil.**

**Sunday I gave the anointing to Frank Leavey a great Irish patriarch who fell and required 8 stitches, and to Jim at Osborn Hospital and prayed:**

**"Through this Holy Anointing,**

**may the Lord in his love and mercy,**

help you with the grace of te Holy Spirt,

and may the Lord who frees you from sin,

save you,

and raise you up!"

Anointing should always be seen as a consolation, rather than as a last resort.
